# From the Principal

Well this was not the end to the term that we had planned!

## **COVID Situation**

THANK YOU to the majority of parents who were able to make arrangement to keep students at home this week. While we would have preferred to be running the school as normal, we all know that to get on top of the current situation we need to work together to minimize opportunity for transmission. We had less than fifty students in attendance on Tuesday and we expect that this number will reduce over the week.



As per the instructions from the Department of Education, we have ceased teaching for the term so that no students who were kept home were disadvantaged.

We gave our Year 12 students the opportunity to either sit the Maths exams that were scheduled for the week or sit a comparable exam on their return next term. Our aim was to be flexible and support student wellbeing. Staff have taken the opportunity this week to collaborate and have deep discussion around curriculum, teaching and learning. You can be proud of the commitment of the staff in our school to ensuring that we are delivering the very best for our students.



## **Emergency Evacuation**

On Monday our school received an email threat that resulted in us having to evacuate the school. At all times the safety and wellbeing of our students and staff was at the forefront of our decision making. As would be expected, I contacted police immediately I had a concern for our safety and evacuated the students immediately. I then operated under the instructions of the police regarding what was safe.

Unfortunately, this resulted in all students and staff having to remain outside for nearly two hours. As soon as possible, we provided students access to toilets and the water bubblers on the oval, and moved them into shaded areas.

As with any situation that is out of the ordinary, we will review what occurred to consider if we can do things better in future.





## **School Review**

Earlier this year our school participated in a School Review where independent senior educators spent time in our school to review what is working well and provide advice on what might be the next focus of work for the coming four years. I was pleased to table the Executive Report at the last P&C meeting and share with those in attendance the key findings of:

- School staff recognise that highly effective teaching is the key to improving student learning and engagement.
- Staff members are committed to the success of all students.
- School leaders articulate a strong commitment to providing a quality education.
- School leaders express a belief in staff continually striving to build their capability to refine their teaching and learning practices, individually and collectively.
- Staff members have high expectations for all students.
- A culture of continuous improvement is being driven by school leaders.
- The school places a strong priority on providing targeted support and resources to advance the improvement agenda and to meet the learning and wellbeing needs of students.
- The school focuses energy and attention on systematic curriculum delivery.
- Partnerships with parents, families, local businesses, industry, community organisations, and other education providers provide a wealth of opportunities and outcomes for students.

- How can I improve?
- Where do I go for help?

This will be emailed home to the key contact parent. We will post copies of the report to those parents who have requested this.

## Parent-Teacher Interviews – April 28

An important step in supporting our students to be successful is to invite parents to come to school and speak with teachers

regarding the content of the report cards, and to discuss the two questions above. A letter with details on how to book interviews is sent home with the report cards. Please follow the instructions on the letter but if you have problems feel free to contact the school office.

To allow staff time to prepare for the interviews, and have enough timeslots to cater to parents, we will be **ending the school day at on April 28 at 12.50pm.** We ask all parents to make arrangements to



collect students from school. Students who are unable to be collected, or travel directly home, can be supervised at school. More details have been provided in the parent-teacher interview letter.

It was pleasing to join with parents last week for the information session on how to make the most of the WTE online tool. We looked at the many exciting features and a number of parents went home ready to challenge their child to the Sentence Train activity.

# **NAPLAN News**

NAPLAN Online will be held in Australia from 11 to 21 May 2021. As a school, Forest Lake SHS is transitioning to the online delivery and implementation of NAPLAN for the first time in 2021. A timetable for your student will be provided to you closer to the date. I encourage you to use the public demonstration tests so students have the opportunity to become more familiar with the NAPLAN Online platform. This can be accessed at home or at school. Schools are required to undertake NAPLAN practice testing for students. This is an opportunity for students to practice using the test platform and also allows testing of our IT systems prior to the actual test. Forest Lake SHS will be conducting Practice Testing for NAPLAN Writing on Wednesday 21 and Thursday 22 April 2021. Results from the practice tests are not recorded and will not be used to calculate student achievement.

Whilst all students in Years 7 and 9 at Forest Lake State High School are expected to participate in the annual NAPLAN assessment, we understand that some students may qualify for adjustments or exemptions that reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments.

#### **Exam Block - Adjustments**

## Term 1 Week 10 – Year 12

Based on the events earlier this week which impacted on the scheduled Exam Block, students were given the option to either sit the exam this week or choose to sit the exam next term.



I am now able to notify students of the days/dates of the comparative exams for the students who chose not to sit their Math exams and the Health students, whose exam was postponed.

The Math exams (MAG, MAM, MAS) will be added to the week 4 exam block, while the Health exam will be held on Tuesday April 20 (Week 1, Term 2) during the first half of the day and will be held in CRC5

### Exam Block - Term 2

#### Term 2 Week 4

The exam block for Term 2 week 4 will be upon us very soon. Exact details of when specific subjects will be is not available to publish at this time, however we can share with you the subjects that will be featuring in the exam block.

A master assessment program will be emailed to all students and parents early next term to assist with planning. The program will outline the assessment sessions that students must attend. There will be NO scheduled classes to attend and NO completion session in this exam period.

Note that students must attend exams rather than any external courses they are enrolled in such as TAFE, WESTEC, or traineeships.

#### \*\*\*\*IMPORTANT INFORMATION\*\*\*\*

Credit can only be accrued for successful completion of units. For example, for Applied and General subjects, students complete Unit 1 and/or Unit 2 or Units 3 and 4 as a pair of units. Students are expected to complete all course and assessment requirements of the syllabus as developed by the school. In order to receive an overall subject result for Units 3 and 4, students MUST complete Units 3 and 4 as a pair, providing responses to each summative internal assessment and the common internal assessment (CIA) for Applied (Essential) subjects. Where there is no evidence of a response to each summative assessment on or before the due date set by the school, as subject result cannot be allocated. If students do not submit an assignment, or do not attend an assessment session, and there is no explanation, teachers will use drafts and classwork to determine a result. However, if a teacher has no evidence of student work, they will not be able to give a result. This could mean no QCE credit. IF this is subject is ENGLISH students can forfeit their ability to obtain an ATAR.

Failure to attend assessment can affect QCE eligibility, put students at risk of losing credit, place them at risk of being eligible for Forest Lake SHS Senior PRIDE rewards (including the Formal) or place their enrolment at risk.

You must provide a medical certificate if you are absent for an exam/assessment, as per QCAA guidelines and outlined in the school Learning to Assessment policy and submit a Variation to Assessment application (refer to https://forestlakeshs.eq.edu.au and click on Curriculum -Senior School).

It is essential that students are adequately prepared for their assessment by knowing what exam to attend, what time to be there and what room to go to. If you believe they require adjustment to regular assessment conditions, it is their responsibility to see the Guidance Officer or Deputy Principal prior to the assessment, and submit a Variation to Assessment form (available on the website as outlined above) with sufficient notice for evidence of support to be obtained and processed.

#### Variation to Assessment

Variation to Assessment leading to an AARA (Access Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustment)

The single biggest change in the New QCE system is the significantly raised level of expectations around completing assessment tasks by and/or on the set date. The final result for each General and Applied subject will be based on four (4) formal assessment tasks only, mostly completed in Year 12, which means completion dates will be strictly followed to ensure fairness for all.

As always, Forest Lake State High School will assist and support students where their circumstances mean they are not on a level playing field with other students. If students require short, medium or long term assistance, the first step in any situation to seek support is to complete and submit a Variation to Assessment application.

This application will be processed by the Year Level Deputy Principal and, if successful, will result in an Access Arrangement or Reasonable Adjustment (AARA) to assist the student to complete the assessment task. As an example, this could mean an extension on an assignment due date. Complete details can be found in the Forest Lake Learning to Assessment Policy.

If students' believe they require adjustment to regular assessment conditions, it is their responsibility to see the Guidance Officer or Deputy Principal prior to the assessment, and submit a *Variation to Assessment* form **policy** (refer to https://forestlakeshs.eq.edu.au and click on Curriculum - Senior School) with sufficient notice for evidence of support to be obtained and processed.

## **Senior School Expectations**

## Formal Eligibility

As we end term 1, it is vital that everyone is aware of what is required to maintain eligibility for upcoming PRIDE events in 2021 for year 12. As a reminder, I have listed them below, and Mr Alpert will remind students regularly of these.

- All assessment items must be **completed and submitted** by the due date.
- Students will achieve a satisfactory minimum for effort and behaviour on their reports results.
- Students **will have a 95% attendance rate**. More than 2 days absent will put student at risk.
- All outstanding detentions must be completed.
- Students will meet the school's PRIDE expectations for behaviour as detailed in the school's Student Code of Conduct. Students will have no major behaviour incident records in OneSchool in any one (1) term.
- It is expectation that all school fees are up to date to access senior school rewards event.

# YEAR 8 UPDATE

## **Monitoring Attendance**

Each week students will be sent an email with their attendance attached (see example below). The information in the Traffic Light Report highlights your student's percentage of attendance at school, this is, how much time they physically attended school and accessed purposeful learning.



What we ask students to do:

Track their attendance

- How is your attendance going?
- Are you on track to assist you to reach your academic goals this year?

 Are you on track to meet the attendance requirement for formal (95% attendance – no more than 3 days absent)

Reflect on their attendance

- If not on track What are you going to do differently this week to lift your attendance?
- If on track What are you going to do to maintain it?

Please email or see Ms Fisher at Freeman mmfis1@eq.edu.au to clarify why your attendance is low (e.g. what days, lessons late):

- If there appears to be a mistake in the class roll-marking, I will then send you to the relevant class teacher to fix your attendance on the roll
- Normal classroom lesson see your teacher for that class

Remember to keep checking your attendance each week on the Year 8 noticeboard (usually up by Mon L2)
